Papers that do not meet the requirements of the following editorial will not be accepted for printing. Please format the article by copying the style of the sample paragraphs.

I. PAPER GENERAL REQUIREMENTS.

- Not numbered pages,
- Connect the illustrations and descriptions in one file (the list of names according to the order in the text to be entered when end of the paper, by points. II.14, served only in the text references to illustrations and their location by point. III.2,
- Never give in the footnotes of literature (please point out any literature in order of appointments, not alphabetical, in the "Bibliography" at the end of the paper, by points. II.10, formatting references to sources and literature in the footnotes are described in the paragraph. II.15).
- 3. The paper should begin with a short introduction (II.4), and end summary (II.8).
- 4. The paper should be divided into chapters. Each chapter should bear the title.
- 5. The maximum volume of paper 10 pages including figures, summary, keywords, footnotes and bibliography.
- 6. Maximum number of drawings 5, a larger amount at the express request of the reviewer work.
- 7. Graphic elements should be prepared in electronic form in legible black and white in separate files. Acceptable formats: jpg,. tif. Bmp. at a resolution of at least 300 dpi.
- 8. The names of image files only by numerical order in the text of the paper (e.g. 1, 2, etc.)
- 9. Collages made of several illustrations should be sent as a graphic file and call it a numeric symbol.
